NOTES FROM THE PARISH COUNCIL MEETING HELD IN THE COMMUNITY HALL, THURSDAY 12th SEPTEMBER 2024

There were 10 Parish Councillors present, one District Councillor and 1 member of the public.

Planning

DC/24/03091:

Hall Farm Cottage, Chattisham. Erection of bridge connecting first floor of existing dwelling to roof void over garage block.(a resubmission with minor changes) No objection.

DC/24/02809:

Broadlands, Duke Street. Erection of single storey rear extension to form annex for family member and a front/side extension. It was noted that this was a large footprint taking up much of the garden and turning a more affordable property into a 5 bedroomed one, but no objections.

DC/24/02258:

2 Cobblers Corner, Creation of vehicular access (retention of). Highways have not approved this so the Parish Council could not approve until the matter is resolved.

DC/24/03633:

Land at Red House Farm, Duke Street. Removal or variation of a condition following planning consent. No objection.

District Council Report

John Whyman gave a lengthy report stating that on shore wind turbines can now be approved due to changes by the new Government which has also set increased new housing targets- which caused a long debate emphasising the importance of having local community plans. Babergh had 56 planning appeals lodged against them in the past 6 months- 82% were upheld, so Babergh has been making valid planning decisions. The implications of car parking charges in Hadleigh were debated-it will be in place before year end.

Community Impact Levy Money Update.

It has been a frustrating time trying to spend our CIL money with many obstacles put in the way. We have managed to get two poles for the new VAS signs but Suffolk Highways will not agree to us installing flashing signs near the school. There are also difficulties with the installation of the proposed village boundary gates. However, our intrepid Chairman will not give up and will continue to state our case.

People and Place Plan-Questionnaires were delivered with the Link and residents can also use the on line option via QR code. There were some errors both with the paper and online copies, but these have been sorted out. It is important that as many people as possible respond so that villagers have a say in the future of their environment. This is part one of the process, further consultation will take place after analysis of the data. At the time of the meeting 90 responses had been received.

Communications

Consideration was given to whether the Parish Council should have its own Facebook page but there were concerns about who would administer it, or be more involved in editing the Village Website, which the PC pays for. The Parish Clerk offered to update the website with PC related items.

Road repairs

- Cllr Eaton complimented Highways for repairing Priory Road. This has become a rat run since the Aldham Road closure which is due to start repairs on Monday. He wondered if Councillor Hudson had got things moving.
- Credit was also given to Highways for their substantial repairs to Chattisham and Mill Lane.
- The Community Council will be trimming the Hintlesham Playing Field hedge along Rectory Lane and George Street.

WILDLIFE IN CHATTISHAM

The pair of Great Tits that fledged under our roof were actually at Hugo Langton's. The birds that are still nesting and fledging is unbelievable. With help I have counted 17 different couples from Robins, Wrens and Finches to Pigeons, Rooks and Crows.

Thanks for the news about Red Kites. In the last ten days I have seen, in the very early morning, 25 gathering which could be looking for food from Chattisham to Washbrook.

Has someone lost a pair of Canaries? They are mostly seen at the bottom of the village and are quite tame.

Michael and Jenny rescued a tiny duckling and handed it over to the Plumbs at Birch Farm House. They had a special lamp to keep the young one warm and when older, they released it into their moat which encouraged other ducks to visit and it all seems to be going well and the duck often returns to see Michael and Jenny, so it's not just elephants that never forget! The other evening we decided to take a ride around the village to see what wildlife was around the highway- we caught sight of 2 foxes, a muntjac mother and two babies, 3 badgers and the wonderful sight of a mother weasel with 5 kits entering a road gully for safety.

The old Blackbirds have made their semi migration but have not made it to Cornwall and Devon yet and their young are still around. If you see any thrushes, please let me know.

There seem to be quite a lot of Sparrow Hawks and Kestrels around which can attack our young song birds, but that is nature. Blue Tits seem to come and go in number and to my knowledge have nested three times. I very seldom see a Woodpecker around although my neighbours have seen a Green Woodpecker. With all the rain this year, the Moorhens seem to have done well. Now that the Harvest has finished, you might see rats looking for food. If you don't want them in your garden it might be time to call pest control.

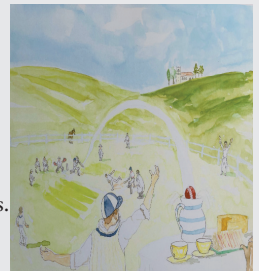
KERSEY CRICKET THRILLER GOES TO THE LAST BALL!
