# NOTES FROM THE PARISH COUNCIL MEETING

## held on Thursday 14<sup>th</sup> November 2024

The minutes from the previous meeting were approved

### Reports from County and District Councillors

The was no report from our County Councillor. District Councillor John Whyman reports that there will be an increase in the amount of new homes required district wide. The Renewable Energy requirement is also forecast to grow.

### Planning Applications

#### **DC/24/04932**

Application to determine if prior approval is required for a proposed Erection of grain store with open sided lean to. Old House, Back Road, Hintlesham, Ipswich Suffolk IP8 3PB. No objections.

#### **DC/24/04897**

Application for Erection of part single storey, part two storey extensions to dwelling, and detached garage/workshop. Foxhaven (Pear Tree Cottage), Silver Hill, Hintlesham, Ipswich Suffolk IP8 3NJ. No objections.

#### **DC/24/04799**

Subdivision of plot and erection of 1No detached dwelling with new vehicular access. Land Adjacent To The Cottage, Duke Street, Hintlesham, Ipswich Suffolk IP8 3PN. No objections.

#### **DC/24/04790**

Discharge of Conditions Application for DC/22/01603 - 7 (Construction Method Statement) and 16 (Surface Water) - Rosslyn House Duke Street Hintlesham Ipswich Suffolk IP8 3QP. No objections.

### CIL Update

Les Cole reported that the quotes for the Village Gates are in. Just under £5,000 for the gates themselves and £2,500 for installation.

Posts are to be installed for the new VAS Signs.

Discussions regarding the Flashing Signs for the 20s Plenty zone outside the school are still ongoing. Councillor Martin asked if it might be a good idea to increase the zone to the top of Timperleys, as many children walk from there.

There is a proposal to site a bench at the Bus Stop on the Hadleigh bound side of Wilderness Hill.

### PPP Update

Councillor Bates reported that around 33% of household in the two villages had responded to the questionnaire. The key points will be published in The Link and on the website.

### Speed Limit on Priory Road

The Parish Council voted to support a review of the speed limit from Park Farm to the bottom of Priory Hill from the existing 60mph down to 30mph.

# NOVEMBER WILDLIFE IN CHATTISHAM

Where have all our birds gone? Well most have been feeding on the 5 acre wildlife field which is full of seeds and lies to the back of our house. Pigeons have been stripping Holly trees and shrubs with help from other birds. Many people ask me why do we breed pheasants to shoot them? My blunt answer is: why do we kill chickens and other meat animals.

We must all make an effort to control the rats which are coming into our garden from the fields. There are only small amounts at the moment but where there is one, there will soon be 10 so please see the rat man.

We are seeing many new colours in our wildlife. In the bird families such as Finches, Sparrows and Crows some are likely to go albino. On the animal side Badgers, Foxes and Squirrels seem most prominent in our villages and many of you talk about changes in colour and coats. Some wonder if it's climate change - it probably is. What a sight from my window early this morning when I spotted two large, young Muntjac deer with their mother eating our roses along with 2 cock Pheasants and 9 hens.

As a reply to Mike re myxomatosis. The virus originated in South America but was intentionally introduced in Australia, France and other countries. It was used in France by a man that only wanted to rid his estate of wild rabbits but it spread across Europe and Britain. The poor man's dinner was wiped out. How does it come back? Well in the past it has been deliberately put down so I will stop there.
