The Friends of Hintlesham with Chattisham Churches

Every 5 years our village churches are subjected to a close inspection by a Diocesan approved architect and work has commenced at St Margarets on a number of recommended projects identified in the last Quinquennial report.

Following a recent inspection the electrical installation has been approved but requires some improvement.

The Church Tower shows signs of movement and following an inspection by our consulting engineer the Large Oak tree nearby requires pollarding to reduce the amount of ground movement in the vicinity. Our engineer has proposed monitoring the tower for movement for a period of 12 months.

For safety reasons 5 Lime trees in the churchyard require the removal of dead branches and reduction in size.

A Tree surgeon has been appointed to undertake the work together with a substantial trimming of the perimeter hedging in the autumn. Due to the complexity of the work the cost will be in excess of £10,000 and is to be funded from the Church Restoration Fund.

The PCC are instigating these works as part of a program to address our architects recommendations and to improve the structural integrity and fabric of the church so it is fit for the 21st Century

The Restoration fund is supported by Suffolk Historic Churches, The Friends of Hintlesham & Chattisham Churches, individual donations and bequests from many generous people within our villages, visitors and those who support the restoration and maintenance of our fine Suffolk Churches.

August Wildlife in Chattisham

I hear the hooting of owls most nights – both Little and Tawny. Many of you have told us that the numbers around are increasing as are the nest boxes. People have asked me about the Red Kites and you have to be up early at this time of year (about 4 am) to see as many as 25 travelling high up from the south east to the north west - then back late evening. Yes you can see them in the day circling round our villages looking for mainly dead creatures to feed on.

Harvest is in full swing and the Starling population has increased as it does every year at this time. As soon as harvest starts the fields become a haven for all birds. Swifts, House Martins and Swallows have all fledged. Eileen Damant has two Swift boxes with one successful and unfortunately the one with the camera in not so lucky. We have a pair of Great Tits that have fledged under our roof panel.

With climate change coming upon us, nature is often confused with breeding taking place too early or late. Pigeons and the Crow family breed all the year round but some smaller birds and garden animals are affected.

A fox somehow came into our conservatory on the last day of July and someone delivering papers saw what they thought was a dog entering our bungalow. I saw it briefly for a few seconds before it ran off.
